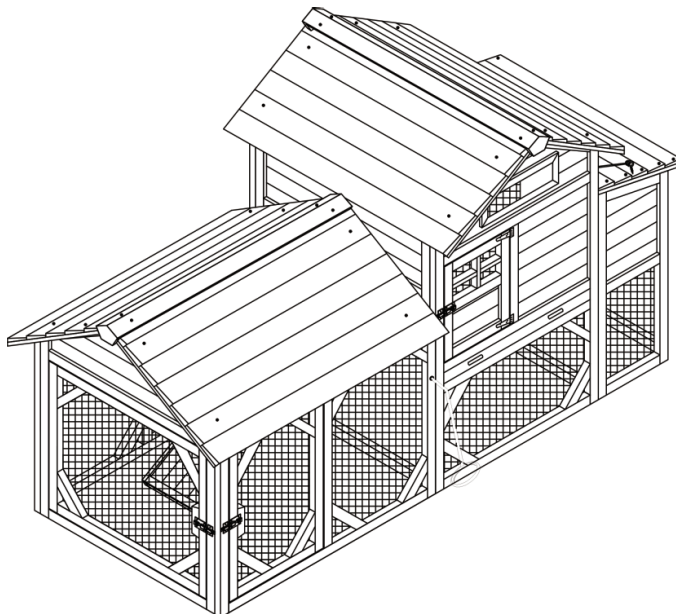
We appreciate your purchase and are confident that you are going to love your new Leghorn Cottage!

BUT don't fear, with these instructions and even referring to the assembly videos on our site it'll be a breeze!











Using a power screwdriver and if you have someone help you hold the panels while you screw the process will be more enjoyable and so much easier =)


As we are shipping you this from Utah the boxes may have looked hammered, but it's the contents that matter. By applying another layer of lacquer or stain you give the wood extra strength against the elements and you will eliminate any scratch on the wood or cosmetic concern from shipping. It's wise to put this additional layer on in the beginning too, since the wood will be settling in place!




## Lets get Started!

- Unpack each box completely
- Identify all pieces (see key below)
- You will be refering to this key throughout the assembly process so keep it handy!



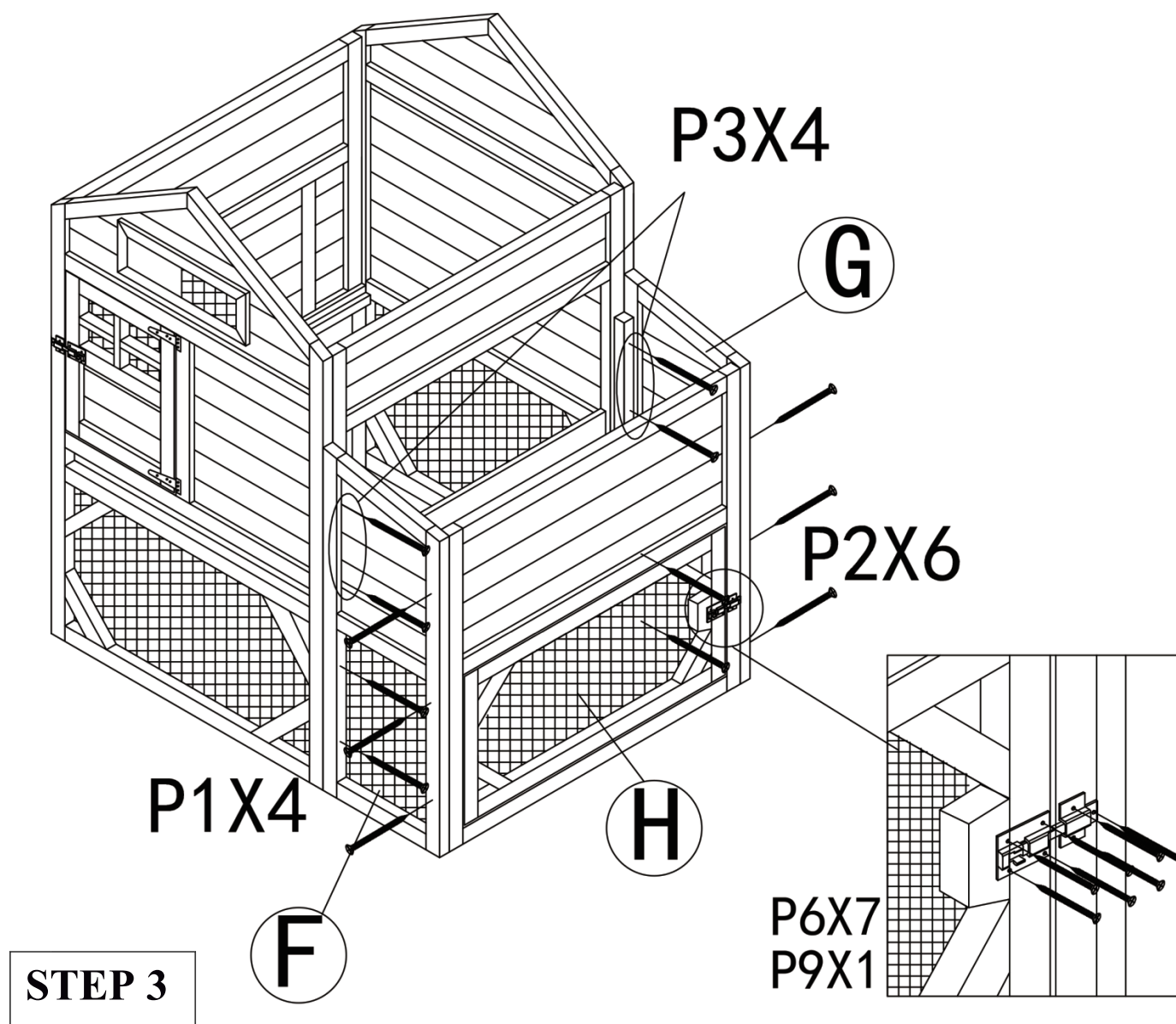
- A, B, C and D are the names of the panels (referring to the key)
- Secure A,B,C,D panels using the 8 screws in the bag labeled P2
- P9 is a latch, install it with the 7 screws in the bag labeled P6

Be sure to line up the panels before screwing them together use the pre-drilled holes

Start screwing from the top and work your way down on each panel  
(The assembly video is a handy tool to have open in the background while you set up your coop)

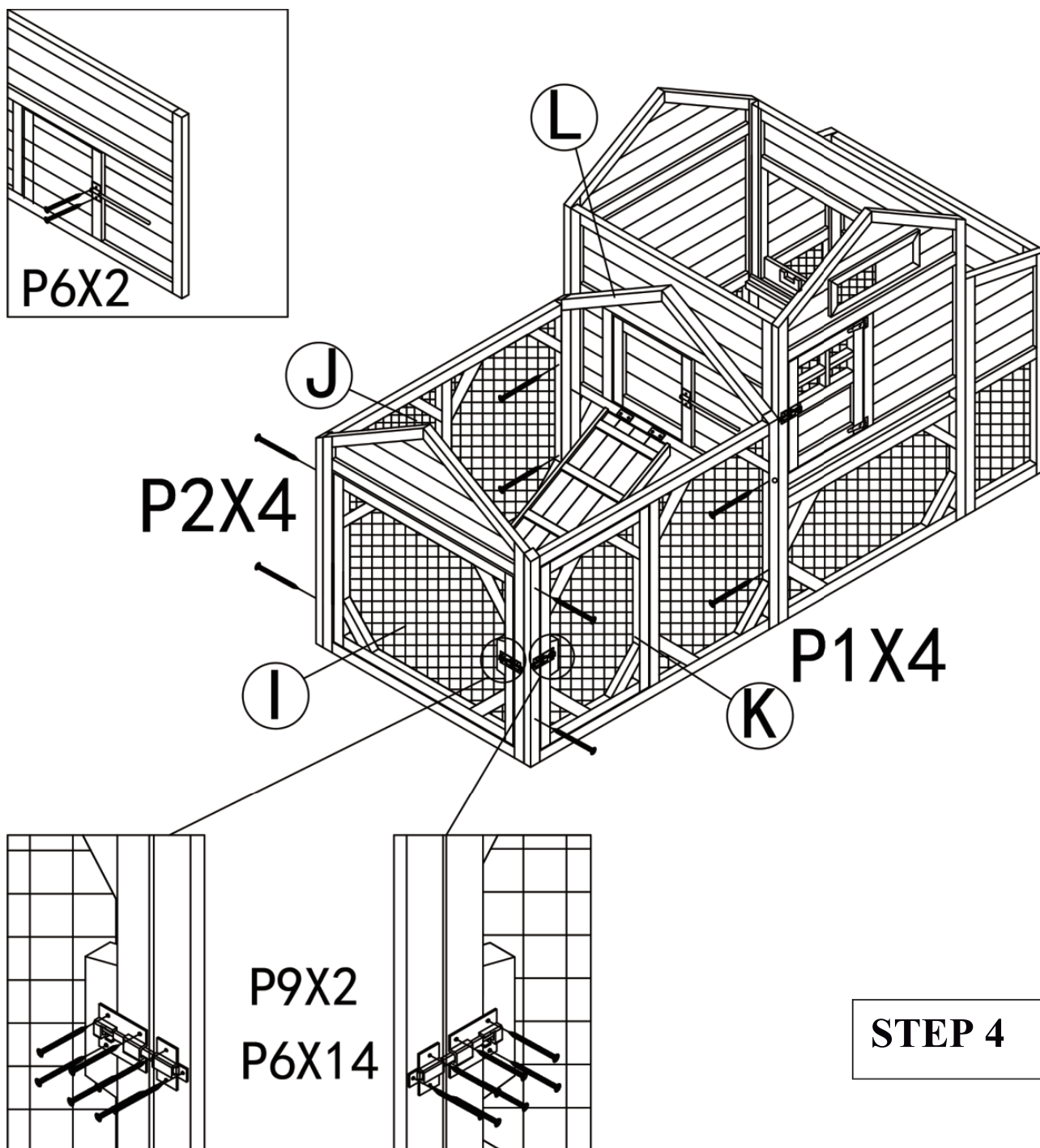


- Secure panel E using the 4 screws from the bag labeled P5

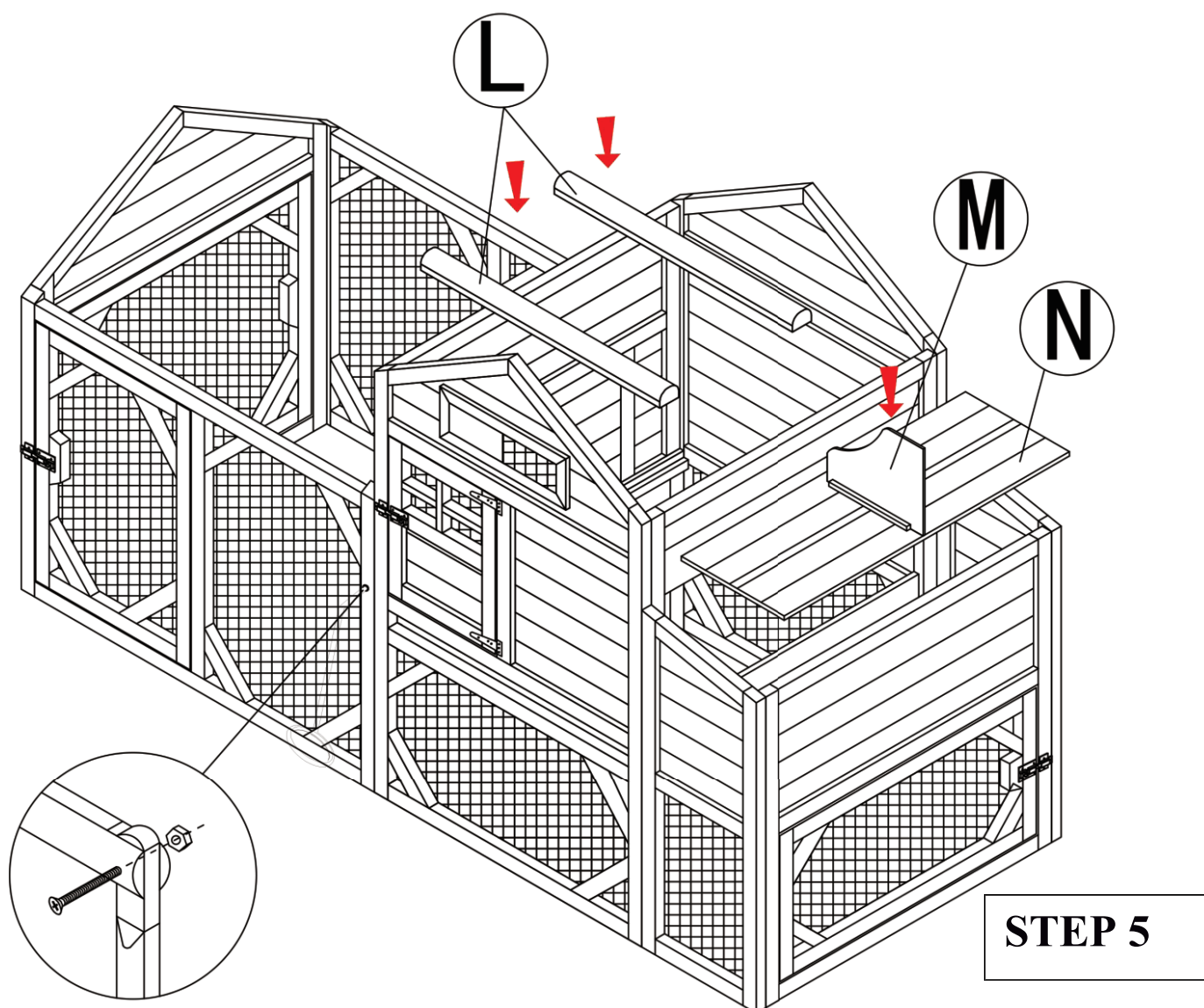


- G, H, F are the names of the next panels (refer back to the to the key)
  - Secure panel F using 4 screws from the bag labeled P1
  - Secure panel G using 4 screws from the bag labeled P3
  - Secure panel H using 6 screws from the bag labeled P2
- Line up the panels and use the pre-drilled holes





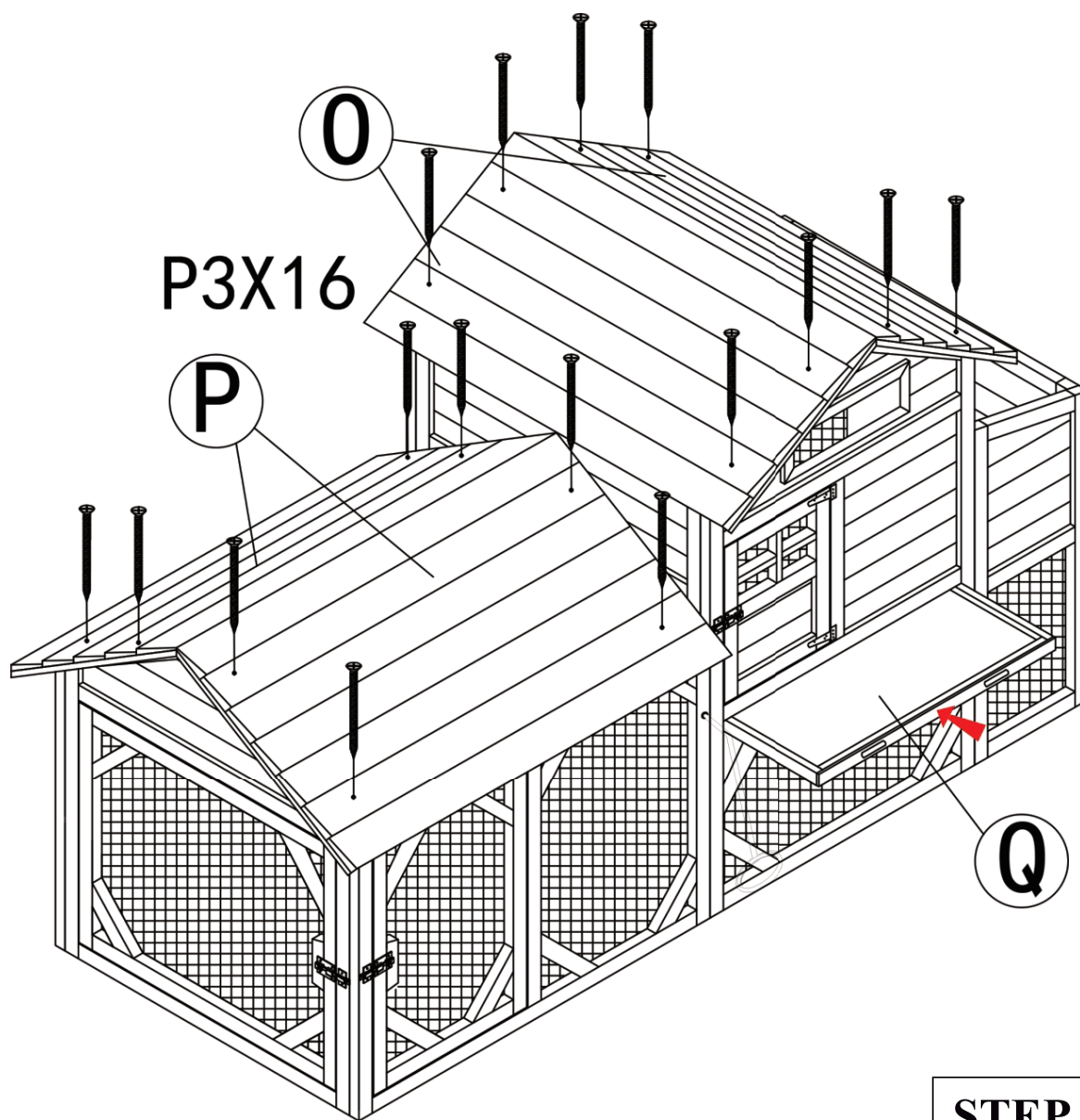
- L, J, I, K are the names of the next panels/pieces (refer back to the key), secure these panels using 4 screws from the bag labeled P1 and 4 screws from the bag labeled P2
- P9 is a latch, secure P9 using P6 screws



## STEP 5

This rod allows you to open and close the door on the hen house from outside of the run.  
Connect the rod to the handle using the small screw and nut

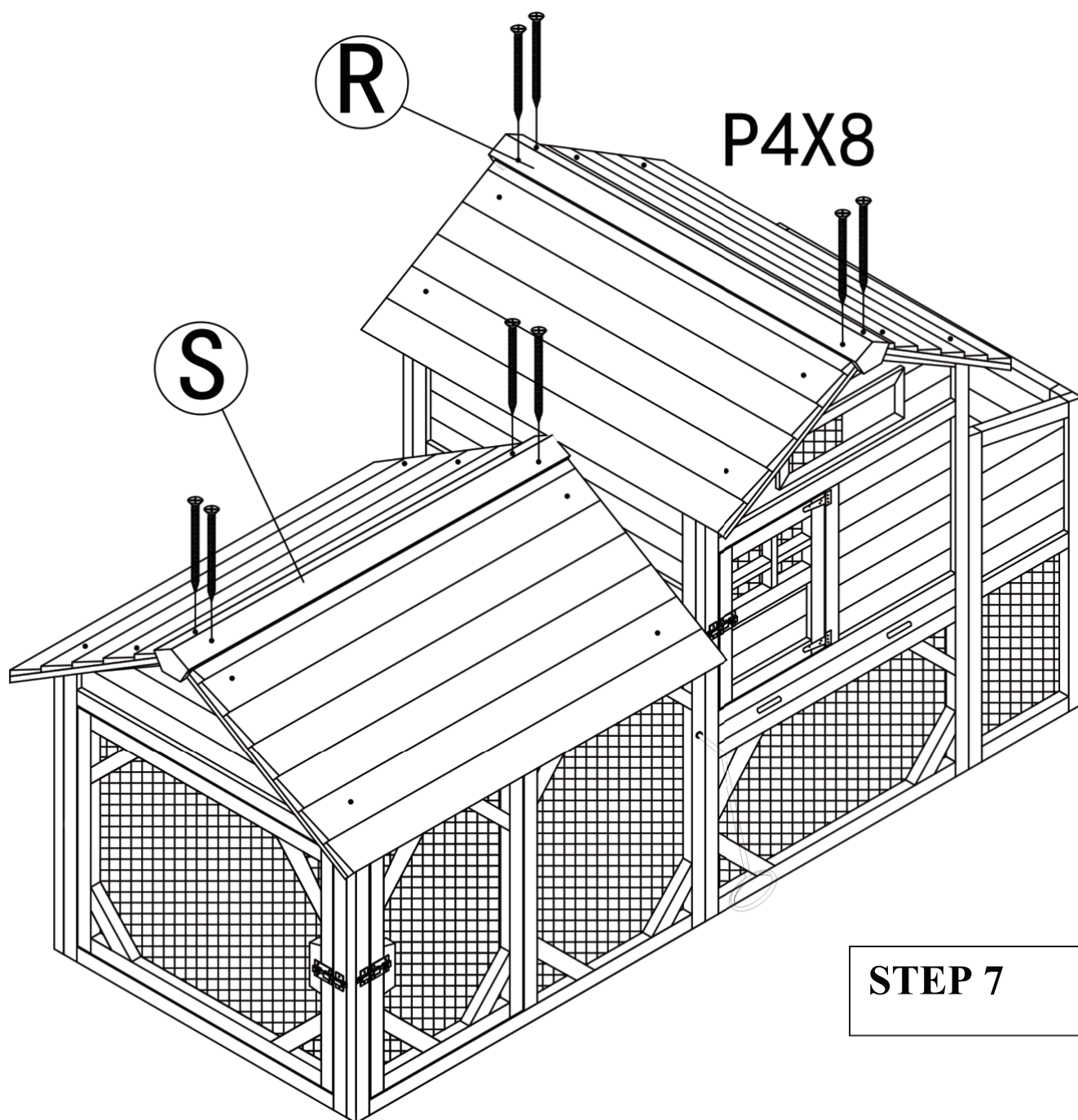
- Insert the two roosting rods (L)
- Insert panels M and N in the egg box



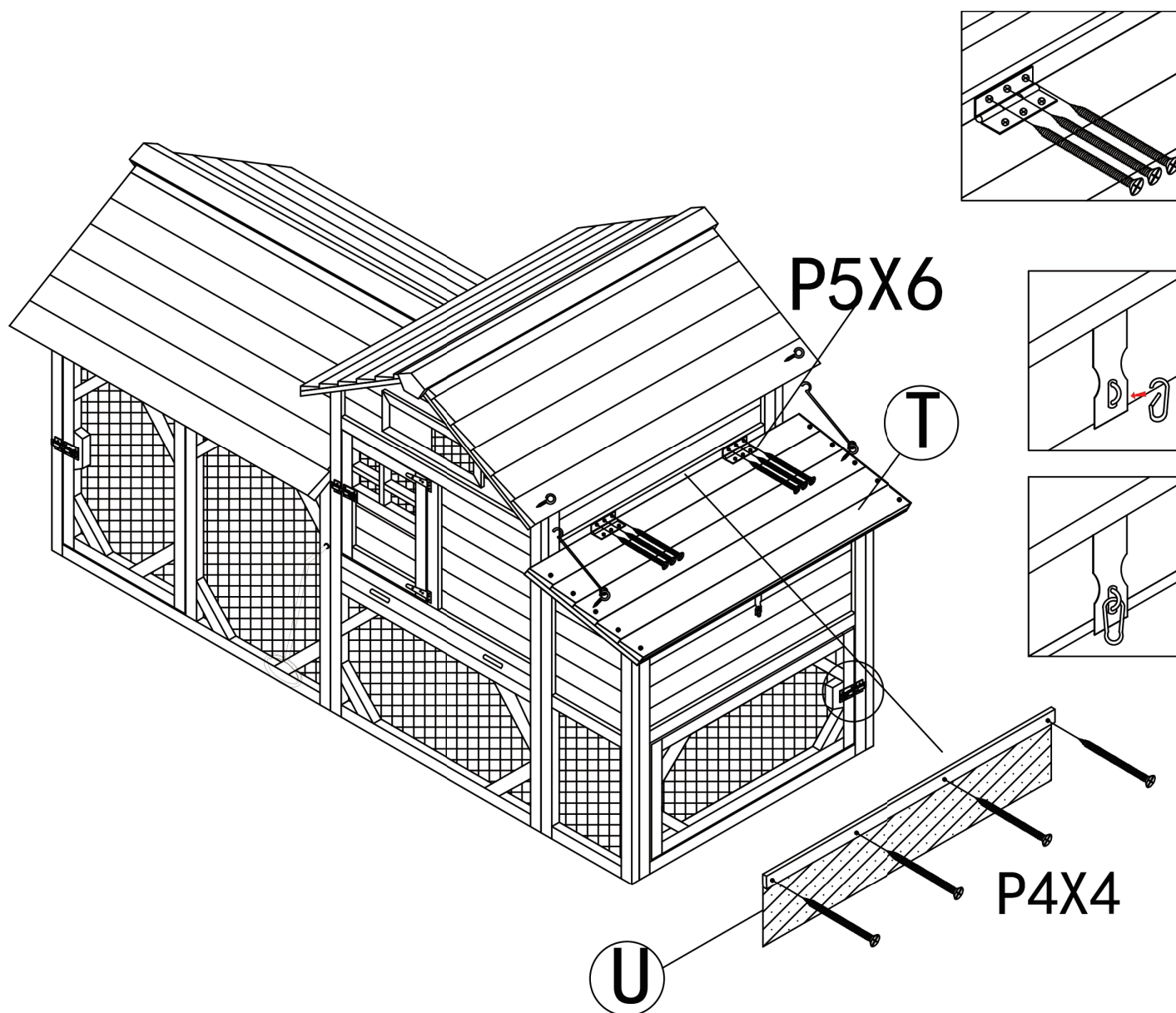
## STEP 6

- O and P are the names of roof panels
- Use 16 screws from the bag labeled P3 to secure the O and P roof panels
- Be sure everything is lined up prior to securing with the screws
- Slide the poop tray in (Q panel)





- R and S are roof caps
- Secure R and S using 8 screws from the bag labeled P4
- Please use the pre-assembling hole



- Secure panel T using 6 screws from the bag labeled P5
- Secure U (flashing) using 4 screws from the bag labeled P4

\*This flashing (piece U) should be installed just above where the nesting box roof lid connects to the hen house. This flashing will help keep the inside of the coop dry.

**It's official, you are all set and your girls have a new home!!**
