Ensure that the screws holding the pump housing to the vacuum cup are securely tightened. Periodically clean the face of the vacuum cup with a soft cloth, dish soap and water. Do not use solvents or abrasive cleaning pads. If the pump feels sluggish or obstructed, pull the plunger straight out of the pasket with silicone gel (our recommended lubricant, Lube Tube, is available on-line at www.seasucker.com). Do not use petroleum-based lubricants on the gasket. Insert plunger back into the pump cylinder and push in until seated normally.

Refurbishment: SeaSucker products that are out of warranty or suffer damage beyond the scope of the warranty can be refurbished. Damaged pumps or vacuum cups can be traded in for new pumps or vacuum cups at a substantial discount from their retail price. For Flip-Down Tank Brackets: <u>Before</u> your flip-down bracket is inserted into the track, your bracket must be fitted to your tank at the desired tension. For example, it is recommended to set 2 clicks out from fully closed for an 80 cubic inch tank. You cannot adjust the bracket once it is placed in track mount. To attach your tank, position the tank against the bracket with one arm horizontal and one arm up. Push the up arm down over the tank until it snaps into horizontal position to secure your tank.
